
SCOTLAND: HIGHLANDS AND LOWLANDS


Dr. Damian Shiels

We are very excited to welcome Dr. Damian Shiels as our newest Ireland scholar. He received his BA in archaeology from University College Cork, an MA in archaeology and heritage management from the University of Leicester and a PhD in history from Northumbria University. He has over twenty years' experience in archaeology and heritage, holding positions from curator in the National Museum of Ireland to company director at Rubicon Heritage Services Ltd., one of Ireland and Britain's largest archaeological firms.

Damian is a specialist in conflict archaeology, post-medieval archaeology and heritage interpretation and has been a regular contributor to tv and radio discussing Irish archaeology and history.

He pioneered the application of conflict archaeology in the Republic of Ireland, leading projects at famous battlefields such as Kinsale, Co. Cork (1601) and Vinegar Hill, Co. Wexford (1798). Damian has published and lectured widely in Ireland, Britain, Europe, and the United States on Irish archaeological and historical topics stretching from prehistory through to the modern-day.





Join Professor Steven Ashby, a Viking specialist, on a 15-day journey to follow the path of the Vikings across four countries: Denmark, Germany, Norway and Sweden. Along this tour, we will stop at intricate stone ship burials, charming villages dating back to the Middle Ages, fortress churches decorated with 800-year-old frescos and museums overflowing with fascinating artifacts from the Viking period.

This extensive traverse also includes four private tours, including Germany's Haithabu Viking Museum in Hedeby, a tour of the Tanum Rock Art (a UNESCO World Heritage Site), the Roskilde Viking Ship Museum, and a private opening of the Hedared Stave Church, offering a one-of-a-kind glimpse into the life of the Vikings few will ever experience.

We will also visit a total of six UNESCO World Heritage sites and spend three full days in Visby, a medieval walled city on Gotland Island.





SRI LANKA


Sri Lanka's fascinating history spans at least three thousand years. Known as Lanka, the 'resplendent land' in the great Indian epic

"Ramayana" written around 500 BC, over the centuries many others have testified to the island's natural beauty. Deep water harbors provided strategic importance and through the ages many great civilizations developed here. Today's Sri Lanka is the home to a fascinating abundance of languages, religions and cultures.

A highlight of this archaeological tour will be the Esala Perahera Festival, a centuries-old celebration of Sri Lankan Buddhism. As elephants process through the streets, they are accompanied by a cacophony of percussionists pounding traditional drums, dancers clanging finger cymbals, and the rhythmic thumping of mock sword battles.

Almost straddling the equator, Sri Lanka's weather is determined by it's two monsoons – one from the northeast and the other from the south-west. In July and August there is a gap in the rains which makes this an excellent time to visit the country!


The Four Corners area of the American Southwest is one of the most breathtaking landscapes in the world. It is an enchanting land of painted deserts, verdant forests, and towering red mesas visible for miles under the brilliant sunlight. This area tells tales of ancient Anasazi, colonial Spanish settlements, and Native American pueblos, all bearing testament to a heritage deeply connected with nature and rich traditions.

Embark on an unforgettable ten-day journey with Far Horizons across the mesmerizing Four Corners, where New Mexico, Colorado, Utah, and Arizona converge. Starting and concluding in Albuquerque, New Mexico, we'll explore the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center and the impressive Maxwell Museum of Anthropology at the University of New Mexico.

Chaco Canyon, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, awaits us, followed by visits to Aztec, and Mesa Verde, another World Heritage Site. He is Curator of Anthropology, Museum of Natural History, and Professor of Anthropology at the University of Colorado. A specialist in the archaeology of the North American Southwest, Dr. Lekson has worked throughout the Four Corners region, including several sites we will visit on the trip. Dr. Lekson is the author of many books and other periodicals, most notably A History of the Ancient Southwest, The Architecture of Chaco Canyon, The Archaeology of Chaco Canyon, and Great Pueblo Architecture of Chaco Canyon, New Mexico. His provocative and challenging book, The Chaco Meridian: Centers of Power in the Ancient Southwest, has created a storm of controversy.

He has been consultant and curator of several projects including the permanent exhibit at Chaco Canyon National Park Visitors' Center, and has presented papers throughout the United States, Canada and Mexico. Dr. Lekson has been an invited speaker at many conferences and public lectures, including the Smithsonian Institution, the Archaeological Institute of America, and the Los Angeles County Museum of Arts, and was a featured speaker on Southwest archaeology on several radio and television specials including National Public Radio, the Discovery Channel, and the History Channel. BULGARIA: THE LAND OF HISTORY

OCTOBER 7-24, 2024

As a full time member of the Far Horizons staff, I am fortunate to be able to join our travelers and act as the tour manager on occasion. Most recently, this past October, I traveled to Bulgaria for our trip led by Dr. Vassil Tenekedjiev. We spent 17 days exploring painted churches, Thracian treasures and tombs, rock-hewn monasteries, Roman ruins, and Ottoman imprints all over this western Balkan country.


I believe one common thread among those of us interested in travel is the understanding that regardless of how many images we have seen, or how much reading we have done, there is no comparison to experiencing cultures, architecture, and history in person. Additionally, somehow still, this knowledge does not prepare us for the emotions which overcome us during our travels. No matter how many places we explore and experience, the sense of wonder and joy never seems to diminish. At least, this is my experience and I hope that you are able to relate.

The cities, sites, and places we visited throughout the country of Bulgaria were no exception. Each day, I was awestruck by the details, the history, and life breathed into the stories by our leader, Vassil. For me, the painted churches and the rock-hewn monasteries were a highlight.

Every study leader with whom I have traveled has woven an educational and historical tale throughout our journey, but having Vassil as our native Bulgarian study leader added a sense of pride to the experience. Even the pieces of history which were not necessarily favorable to the Bulgarian people were shared by Vassil with enthusiasm. For it is all the collective history that brings us to the present day and state.

One aspect of Far Horizons that makes me extremely proud is the philanthropic dedication set in place by our founder, Mary Dell Lucas. As the vast majority of you know, we ask each traveler to contribute \$150.00, separate from the trip cost, which is donated directly to a site or project which we select. What you may not know is that this direct contribution is in addition to a handful of others, which are built into the trip cost and distributed during private entreés throughout the trip.



In Bulgaria, our direct traveler donation was designated for Aladzha Monastery, a rock-hewn monastery near Varna, which lies in the care of the Varna Museum of Archaeology, with which our beloved leader, Vassil, is connected. In the last few years, Vassil oversaw the complete renovation of the main exhibition of the museum on site, a project for which he held much passion and pride. The second phase of the renovation includes replacing informational panels within the site with newly designed, multilingual versions. The individual donations made by the travelers on the trip to Bulgaria will cover the cost of these new panels. Upon return, we received a heartfelt thank you from both Vassil and from Dr. Igor Lazarenko, the Director of the Varna Regional Museum of History.




MOUND BUILDERS

DR. TIMOTHY PAUKETAT

Early archaeologists coined the term 'Mound Builders' for the ancient cultures behind these earthworks. Recent research reveals that these sites were the product of diverse cultures—such as the Woodland, Adena, Hopewell, and Mississippian—evolving over thousands of years by the fertile riverbanks.

In this region, several major centers rose to prominence. We'll focus on the most significant ones, including three UNESCO World Heritage sites: Poverty Point, Cahokia, and Hopewell. Join Dr. Timothy Pauketat, who has spent years studying Cahokia, and a select group of thirteen others on a ten-day archaeological journey to explore these captivating ancient sites. 
Central Asia Silk Road


'Silk Road' - the very phrase conjures up images of camel caravans heavily laden with precious goods, slowly moving along barely-visible tracks through an endless desert. Conquered by names engraved in history books - Alexander the Great, Genghis Khan, Tamerlane - Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, and Tajikistan are where empires were born. But the merchants, missionaries, and warriors who traversed these paths also carried the major religions of **Zoroastrianism** (one of the world's oldest religions), Buddhism, Christianity, Manicheaism, and Islam over the course of time. And the architectural remains of these great belief systems are as breathtaking as they are grand.

The kingdom of Spain has had one of the greatest impacts on world history and civilization. 500 years ago the Conquistadors had just conquered the Aztec Empire of Mexico and were about to start their conquest of the Maya kingdoms. Within a decade they would conquer the Inca of Peru and the wealth in gold and silver that they seized would help make 16th century Spain the richest kingdom and most powerful empire on earth. Who were these Conquistadors who took on indigenous American empires many times larger than their own kingdom and, in the face of enormous odds, conquered them for "gold, God, and glory" and ended up creating the first empire in history "on which the sun never set"?

The Spanish were not always Conquistadors and, eight hundred years before they created their American and world empire in the 16th century, it was they who were the conquered. In 711, Arab and Berber Muslim forces crossed the Strait of Gibraltar and quickly defeated almost the entire kingdom of the Visigoths, a Germanic group that had themselves conquered the Iberian Peninsula. The culture and mindset of the Spanish Conquistadors were born over the long period of the Reconquista of the next eight centuries, during which Spain was contested between the Islamic Moors of fabled al-Andalus and the Christians of the north, whose kingdoms of Asturias, Leon, Castile, and Aragon would eventually merge to become the powerful Spanish kingdom and empire of the 16th century.

One cannot understand the Conquistadors without understanding the Reconquista. On this trip we will visit the famed lands of Castile and its many castle-topped hills, lands over which proto-conquistadors contended with Moorish armies over many centuries, and where Don Quixote would chase their ghosts as he tilted at windmills. We will also visit Extremadura, the parched land of western Castile where Cortes and Pizzaro and so many of the other fearsome Conquistadors came from. Toledo is located in the very center of Spain and was the capital of the Visigothic kingdom and its archbishop is still the head of the Catholic church in all of Spain. Toledo is a wonderfully preserved medieval city and its major sites include churches, mosques, and synagogues, attesting to the remarkable religious tolerance of the Moorish emirs and caliphs of al-Andalus.

Our trip will take us to the heartland of the fabled al-Andalus, including Córdoba and Granada. We will also visit Seville, the port in southern Spain from which the Spanish would set sail for the Americas. Here Christopher Columbus is buried in the gigantic cathedral. Merida is an ancient Roman city in western Spain whose ruins so impressed the Conquistadors that they renamed the Maya capital of Yucatan, also famous for its own extensive ruins, in its honor. Our trip concludes with visits to the wonderfully preserved medieval cities of Salamanca and Avila and a special tour of the castle of Zorita de los Canes, where Dr. Guenter has worked and which perfectly exemplifies the diverse ethnic history of medieval Spain.

Embrace the rich, layered history of Sicily and experience the blend of cultures that shaped its unique identity.


