Daily Itinerary

Day 1 Arrive in Mexico City, Transfer to Cuernavaca

Begin your journey with a warm welcome to Mexico as you arrive in bustling Mexico City. From there, transfer to Cuernavaca, a charming town known as the "City of Eternal Spring" due to its temperate climate. Settle into the stunning Hostería Las Quintas, a tranquil hotel surrounded by lush gardens and our home for two nights.

Day 2

Teotenango, Malinalco

After a refreshing breakfast, begin today with a visit to Teotenango, one of the region's most impressive ancient cities. The towering ruins and intricate stone carvings of this once-thriving Matlatzinca site will offer you fascinating insights into Mexico's pre-Columbian history.

Enjoy a leisurely lunch at a local restaurant before heading to the picturesque town of Malinalco, where ancient temples blend seamlessly into the surrounding hillsides. Here we explore Cuauhcalli, or House of the Eagles, the stunning Aztec period temple carved into the living rock, dedicated to the ancestral warriors who reached celestial paradise after falling in battle.

Return to Cuernavaca in the late afternoon with dinner on our own. (B/L)

Day 3

Casa de Cortés Museum, Tepotzlan

Day 7

Día de los Muertos in Huaquechula

Marvel at the grandeur of the Pyramid of the Sun and the Pyramid of the Moon as you walk through the Avenue of the Dead, gaining a deep understanding of this ancient city's significance. Enjoy a unique lunch at the Cave Restaurant, set within a natural cave near the ruins.

Return to Mexico City for a thought-provoking lecture that delves into the history and mysteries of Teotihuacan, providing a deeper context to your day's exploration. The scale and mystery of Teotihuacan are sure to leave you in awe of Mexico's ancient civilizations. (B/L)

Day 10

Anthropology Museum, Templo Mayor

Delve into the treasures of Mexico's National Museum of Anthropology, one of the world's leading institutions dedicated to pre-Columbian cultures. Here, you'll see iconic artifacts such as the Aztec Sun Stone and other relics that offer insight into Mexico's rich past.


As a tour company that benefits from the cultural and natural riches of our destinations, we have a policy of donating to the scientific and cultural sites and projects which we visit. This has created a bond between Far Horizons and the academic and local communities that has helped us establish an extensive list of lecturers and contacts in each of our destinations. We ask that each participant donate to the noteworthy project we designate. The donation amount is \$150.00 per person. Note that the donation is required as part of your registration for the trip and that it is non-refundable.

Exchange Rate Fluctuations

Prices are based on currency exchange rates keeping below a projected level. While it is unlikely, if the exchange rates should change substantially, Far Horizons reserves the right to charge an additional amount to the trip cost.

Registration

A deposit of \$1000 per person is required along with your registration & health forms, which will be linked in the email confirmation you receive once you pay your deposit on our booking platform. Final payment is due 120 days before departure. Prior to departure, you will be sent a reading list and a tour bulletin containing travel information.



Cancellation

Cancellations received in writing at least 120 days before departure will receive a refund less a \$500 per person administrative fee. Cancellations received less than 120 days before the departure date will not receive a refund. If for any reason you are unable to complete the trip, Far Horizons will not reimburse any fees. Upon registering for the tour, the purchase of travel protection with both trip cancellation and emergency evacuation is strongly advised. Links to recommended insurance policies will be included in the email you receive confirming receipt of your deposit.

Expectations During Travel

Our trips are designed for flexible, energetic people who like to be active, have a spirit of adventure and a positive attitude. We have designed this trip to be as comfortable as possible, while also aiming to visit some remote or unique sites that other companies do not attempt to include in their itineraries. There may be days where we have very long drives and the conditions of the roads may vary. Hotels and transportation in some remote areas may not be up to western standards. There may be times when no bellhops are available; please pack with the understanding that you need to be able to handle your own luggage at times. Sometimes we may be walking over uneven trails for a mile or more; hiking boots are strongly recommended. Not every meal will be haute cuisine and several lunches may be picnics or box lunches. By maintaining a flexible attitude we will soon be captivated by the beauty of the natural scenery, the hospitality of the local people, and the fascinating sites we will see. Your flexibility and patience will be appreciated.

Air Ticketing

International round trip flights are not included in the cost of the trip. If Far Horizons must change the trip dates or cancel the trip for any reason, Far Horizons is not responsible for any air ticket you may have purchased. Please send your complete air schedule as soon as you have it. NOTE: Please contact Far Horizons if you would like for us to handle your air ticketing.

Private Tours and Talks

The private tours of archaeological sites and talks by specialists are scheduled in advance and include a donation to each. Specialists working at these sites are excited about showing their work to interested enthusiasts. However, please be aware that there may be times when the director or a member of the staff may not be on site when our groups arrive due to other commitments.

Walking and Standing

Far Horizons expects all participants to be physically active and able to walk and climb independently throughout the full touring days. This includes walking over uneven terrain (uphill and downhill) for 2 miles or more at each site. You should expect to be on your feet for much of each day, averaging as much as 5 miles of walking per day. As such, each participant should be able to walk unaided at a pace of 3 miles per hour for at least an hour at a time, and to stand unsupported for at least 60 minutes. Bearing this in mind, we suggest that, if you have not already done so, you begin walking several miles every day, ideally including stairs and hills. If you have questions about your ability to keep up with the group or the strenuous nature of this trip, please contact the Far Horizons staff.



Travel Insurance

We strongly recommend that you consider purchasing travel insurance. Should illness or an unforeseen event force you to cancel your travel plans after your final payment or during your trip, it would be doubly unfortunate to incur a significant financial loss. Trip cancellation protection will enable you to be reimbursed for the loss of your payment if you are unable to travel for any of the covered reasons in the "Outline of Coverage" section, or should you have an accident or suffer from any medical conditions during the trip.

Meet Your Study Leader... Dr. Travis Stanton

Travis Stanton is a Mesoamerican archaeologist and Full Professor at the University of California Riverside.

With a Ph.D. from Southern Methodist University (2000) he has worked in Mexico since 1995, primarily directing projects in the states of Yucatan and Quintana Roo; his current field research is heavily focused on Chichen Itza, the great Early Postclassic city of the Maya and UNESCO World Heritage site, for which is has co-created the working 3D model of the site.

For nearly a decade (from 2004-2013), Travis was a professor at the Universidad de las Américas Puebla, located among the ruins of the ancient city of Cholula in Central Mexico, and has spent extensive periods of time in the Gulf Coast Region. These experiences give him a profound grounding across several regions of Mesoamerica, and Central Mexico, where he engages in iconographic, digital archaeology. and oral history projects, is his second home.

Among numerous journal articles and book chapters, Travis has published ten books, including a fundamental <u>pedagogical text</u> on the workings of archaeology and a <u>wide-sweeping edited</u> <u>volume</u> covering the Early Postclassic across Mesoamerica.
